Contents of Training	1.Overview of Training Courses （1）China’s National Realities, Reform and Opening-up Process: to offer an introduction on political, social, and historical development of China, alongside an overview of the development trajectory and achievements of China’s reform and opening-up. （2）China’s Practice and Experience in Pandemic Response: to provide an introduction on measures taken and current state of play of China’s response to Covid-19.		

(3) China's Model for Talent Cultivation in Think Tanks: to introduce the approach and experience of talent recruit, cultivation, development and management in Chinese think tanks, by taking the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences as an example.

(4) China's Macroeconomic Landscape in the Post Pandemic World: to introduce the current status of macro economy in China, especially the characteristics of its post-pandemic economic development.

(5) China's Political System and Xi Jinping's Thought on Governance: to introduce China's current political system, political life and the features of decision-making process for fundamental policies, as well as the multiparty cooperation system led by the Communist Party of China.

(6) China's Think Tank System: to introduce the results of China's efforts on think tank system and new types of think tanks, allowing participants to understand the models of operation of Chinese think tanks and how they contribute to China's policy-making process.

(7) China's Think Tanks and International Governance: to explain the characteristics of think tanks in China on foreign policy research and consultation, as well as their enabling roles for the Belt and Road Initiative.

(8) The Belt and Road Initiative and International Cooperation: to introduce the main contents, values and practices of the Belt and Road Initiative proposed by China, as well as international cooperation thereof.

(9) Practice and Method for Investigation of National State of Affairs: to introduce how Chinese think tanks organize investigation of national state of affairs, including project initiation, team setup, staff organization, use of budget, project results and policy implications.

(10) Think Tanks' Influence on Public Opinion: to introduce the social influence of Chinese think tanks, explaining how they influence public opinion and policy agenda.

(1) To explore recommendations and ideas on international cooperation with the experts on international relations from the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences (CASS).

(2) To explore pathways for think tank capacity building with the experts on think tank development from the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences (CASS).

(3) To explore cooperation on talent training along the Belt and Road countries with education experts from UCASS.

(4) To organize comparative discussions on economic and social development models along the Belt and Road countries with experts from the China-Africa Institute.

(5) To share experience and reflections among participants for internal summary and conclusion of seminar activities.
