Directions to Gaston Hall:

From Main Gates (59 & 60): From 37th and O Streets NW, walk straight ahead into Healy Hall (51). Once inside, make a left and walk briefly down the arched corridor. On the left will be a staircase and elevator. Proceed from here to the third floor and entrance to Gaston Hall.

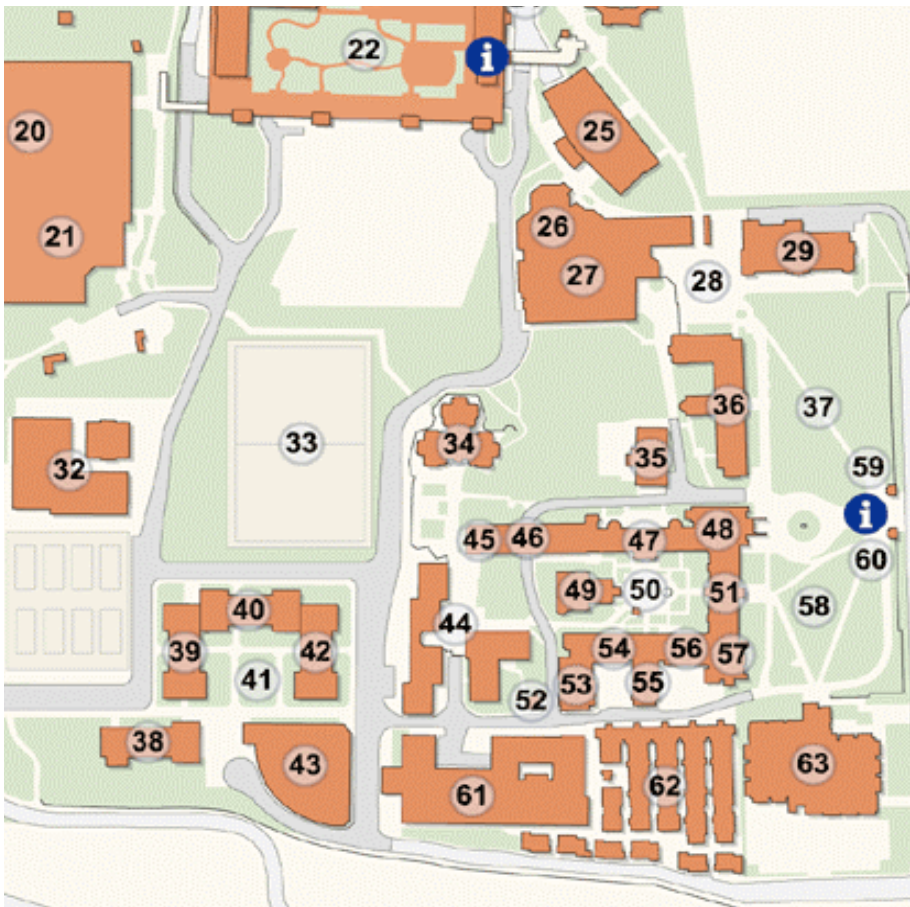
From Southwest Parking Garage (38): Take elevator to level 1. Follow path toward O'Donovan Hall (43) in the direction of the hill. Continue straight past O'Donovan Hall and follow Library Walk uphill until you reach the library (63). Then turn left and walk to the front door of Healy Hall (51). Once inside, make a left and walk briefly down the arched corridor. On the left will be a staircase and elevator. Proceed from here to the third floor and entrance to Gaston Hall.

From Medical Center Parking (located below building 22 on the map below): At the end of the parking lot you will see a sidewalk in front of you. Walk up the diagonal path and the Leavey Center (25) will be on your right. Look for signs for the ICC building (27), which is the big red brick building, off Red Square (28). If the ICC is on your right, the building in front of you is Copley Hall (36). Continue past Copley Hall until you reach Healy Hall (51). Turn right into Healy Hall. Once inside, make a left and walk briefly down the arched corridor. On the left will be a staircase and elevator. Proceed from here to the third floor and entrance to Gaston Hall.

Driving to Southwest Garage: From M Street NW, continue past Key Bridge onto Canal Rd, turn right into campus at Hoya Saxa sign, enter garage at the second right. Parking costs \$3/hr, cash only.

Driving to Medical Center Parking: Take Wisconsin Ave. north to Reservoir Rd. and turn left into Georgetown University Hospital Entrance 1 (3900 Reservoir Rd, NW).

Free Buses: Depart every 10 minutes to/from Rosslyn and Dupont Circle. Ride time is approximately 15 minutes. From Rosslyn (Blue/Orange) exit right from escalator onto N. Moore Street and turn left. Cross 19th Street and there is a GUTS bus stop on the corner. This bus drops off above the Southwest Garage (38). From Dupont Circle (Red) use the Q St exit. Off the escalator, turn left and walk up to the first intersection (20th Street and Mass Ave) and turn to the right and cross 20th Street. This bus drops off at the Georgetown University Medical Center near the Leavey Center (25).



Directions to Dahlgren Quadrangle (50):

From Main Gates (59 & 60): From 37th and O Streets NW, walk straight ahead into Healy Hall (51). Once inside, make a left and walk down the arched corridor. Halfway down the hallway, turn right and proceed outside the double doors to the tent.

From Southwest Parking Garage (38): Take elevator to level 1. Follow path toward O'Donovan Hall (43) in the direction of the hill. Continue straight past O'Donovan Hall and follow Library Walk uphill until you reach the library (63). Then turn left and walk to the front door of Healy Hall (51).
