Martina Strong Charge d'Affaires, US Mission to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia

Martina Strong is honored to lead the US Mission to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia as Chargé d'Affaires. She is joined in Riyadh by her husband, U.S. Army Col. John L. Strong (Ret.) and their daughter Eleanore. A career member of the Senior Foreign Service, Ms. Strong previously served in Iraq as Political Minister Counselor in Baghdad and as the U.S. Army's Political Advisor in Basrah. Prior to her arrival in Riyadh, she was the Deputy Chief of Mission in Bulgaria. Her other overseas postings included Poland, the Czech Republic, Bosnia Herzegovina, and France. Ms. Strong also spent two years as Director on the National Security Council at the White House, where she headed the

U.S. government's multi-agency effort to organize the 2004 G-8 Summit in Sea Island, as well as two other G-8 Summits and various multilateral meetings. The Department of State has recognized Ms. Strong's achievements with numerous awards, including the AFSA Sinclaire Language Award and eleven Superior Honor and Senior Performance Awards. During her service in Iraq, the U.S. Army awarded her the Meritorious Civilian Service Award and the Superior Civilian Service Award. In Bulgaria, the defense minister honored Ms. Strong with the Meritorious Service Medal for her contributions to the US-Bulgarian security partnership.

Amr Talaat appointed Ms. Asaad to serve on the Board of Directors for the Information Technology Industry Development Agency (ITIDA), which helps drive digital transformation and competitiveness as well as contributes towards economic growth. As a board member, Ms. Asaad works alongside a wider team of industry leaders to identify the needs of the local IT industry and address those needs by fostering ties with local and international players, implementing suitable programs, and advising on policy.

Executive Vice President and Senior Advisor, Boeing

Leanne Caret is Executive Vice President and Senior Advisor for the Boeing Company and a member of the company's Executive Council. Most recently, Ms. Caret served as President and Chief Executive Officer of Boeing Defense, Space, & Security, which provides solutions for defense, government, space, intelligence, and security customers worldwide. Defense, Space & Security has prominent operations in many countries beyond the United States, including Australia, India, Saudi Arabia, and the United Kingdom. In 2021, Boeing's revenue from defense and space platforms and services exceeded \$33 billion.

Ms. Caret was previously President of the company's Global Services & Support organization; Chief Financial Officer of Defense, Space, & Security; Vice President and General Manager of Vertical Lift; Vice president of H-47 Programs; and General Manager of Global Transport & Executive Systems. She is a second-generation Boeing employee who started working for the company in 1988. Fortune magazine named Ms. Caret to its Most Powerful Women list in 2021 for the fifth consecutive year. In addition to being a 2019 inductee of the Women in Aviation International Pioneer Hall of Fame, Ms. Caret is a Royal Aeronautical Society Fellow and an American Institute of Aeronautics and Astronautics Associate Fellow. She is also on the George W. Bush Institute's Women's Initiative Policy Advisory Council; the board of directors for the Kansas State University Foundation; the board of directors for Deere & Company; and the board of directors for FIRST, a leading youth-serving nonprofit advancing STEM education.

Penelope (Penny) Naas is UPS President for International Public Affairs and Sustainability. She began her UPS career in May 2012, managing the Public Affairs team for the EMEA Region, where she enhanced governmental understanding of UPS and the issues impacting the logistics industry. In 2014, Ms. Naas was also asked to oversee sustainability in Europe, and has worked to advance internal and external appreciation of the importance of sustainability for UPS. She then served as UPS Vice President and District Manager for International Public Affairs and Sustainability from January 2015 until early

2020. Previously, Penelope worked for Citigroup in the Global Government Affairs team and at the US Department of Commerce (DOC), where she worked for 13 years in various roles covering international trade and commercial issues.
