Information clause pursuant to Articles 13 and 14 of the GDPR*

Data Administrator Personal	The controller of your personal data is the Minister of Energy, 00-450 Warsaw, Przemysłowa Street 26, Poland.
Data Protection Officer	In matters related to the protection of personal data, you can contact the Data Protection Supervisor by e-mail: iod@me.gov.pl or in writing to the following address: Data Protection Supervisor, Ministry of Energy, 00-450 Warsaw, ul. Przemysłowa 26, Poland.
Purpose of processing	Your data will be processed for the purpose of registration and participation in the Conference (hereinafter referred to as the Conference)
Legal basis for processing	Your personal data will be processed on the basis of Article 6 paragraph 1 letter a of the GDPR* (i.e. the data subject has consented to the processing of personal data for a specific purpose, i.e. registration and participation in the Conference), on the basis of Article 6 paragraph 1 letters d and f of the GDPR* (i.e. processing is necessary to protect the vital interests of the data subject or another natural person, and processing is necessary for the purposes of the legitimate interests pursued by the controller). The vital interest of the data subject consists in the controller's obligation to ensure the protection of health and life during the Conference. The legitimate interest consists in the possibility of performing the contract concerning participation in the Conference, therefore the controller processes personal data such as: first and last name, e-mail address, telephone number, PESEL number/passport number of the person registered to participate in the Conference. Then, on the basis of Article 6 paragraph 1 letter c GDPR* (i.e. processing is necessary to fulfill the legal obligation incumbent on the controller) to fulfill the obligation to archive documents resulting from the Act of 14 July 1983 on national archival resources and archives (Journal of Laws 2020, item 164, i.e. of 2020.02.03).
Data recipients	The recipients of your personal data will be employees authorized to process personal data; in addition, personal data may be made available to entities authorized to do so under applicable law, and to entities providing us with services requiring access to personal data.
Data transfer outside the EEA	Your personal data will not be transferred to third countries or international organizations, with the exception of the United States of America as a co-organizer of the Conference.
Storage period	Your personal data will be stored for the period appropriate for storing the documentation in question, in accordance with the Office Instructions in force at the Ministry of Energy and the regulations on document archiving.
Your rights	You have the right to: • access to your personal data; • rectification of your personal data; • deletion of personal data when the data is not processed to fulfil an obligation arising from legal provisions; • restrictions on data processing, subject to the cases referred to in Article 18(2) of the GDPR*; • data portability subject to the provisions of Article 20(1) of the GDPR*; • raise an objection for reasons related to your particular situation.

The right to lodge a complaint with the supervisory authority	You have the right to lodge a complaint with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office if you believe that the processing of your personal data violates the provisions of the GDPR*.
Information about the requirement to provide data	Providing your personal data is necessary to register and participate in the Conference. Failure to provide your personal data will result in your inability to participate in the Conference.
Profiling	Your personal data will not be subject to automated decision-making, including profiling.
Source and scope of personal data	If your data were not made available directly by you, they were made available by representatives of the entity with which you registered your participation in the Conference.
